Hosted by Dame Esther Rantzen. the Awards showcase the innovation and care excellence of the not-for-profit care and support sector. The fantastic afternoon saw more than 250 people come together to celebrate and enjoy live music from The Beathovens, the only band in the UK whose members are all on the autism spectrum and are living in full time care.



Lisa was joined at the awards ceremony by support staff Rebecca Almond, Anthony Harkin, Jacqui Pitt, Diane Rudd, Rob Royds and Julie Williamson, as well as Chief Executive David Sargent, Executive Director Vivien Simon and Area Manager Tracy Connelly.

Oulton Hall in Leeds served as the venue for the launch of the Annual Review, which was attended by key suppliers, stakeholders and senior members of staff.



We are therefore thrilled to be launching Learn My Way; an exciting new online learning platform, which is available to access at any time.

Real Life Options is now an official partner of the Online Centres Network who provide Learn My Way and the wide range of free learning materials available have been specially designed by The Good Things Foundation to support people with little or no computer skills to become digitally inclusive.

"Exploring the modules available will help you grow in independence and confidence in everyday life."

Learn My Way consists of over 30 different easyto-learn modules, which take around half an hour each to complete. The modules cover all the basics for all levels, from switching on your computer and using a mouse and keyboard, to online safety, improving your health online and accessing public services.

The modules also cover useful online practices such as managing your money, navigating social media and using Universal Jobmatch to search for work. The modules are entirely free and you will receive an official certificate for each module completed.



With the Internet at your fingertips you could research your family history, subscribe to healthy eating channels and stay in touch with distant friends and family.

"You can access Learn My Way on your computer, tablet or smartphone and explore the modules available which will help you grow in independence and confidence in everyday life," said Anthea Sully, Head of Business Development and Communications.



Scottish Social Services Council (SSSC)

Service Managers begin rolling programme to aid SSSC registration

Remember that all Scottish staff (Housing Support Services or Care at Home Services) will be legally required to be registered with the Scottish Social Services Council (SSSC) by 18th October 2019.

Although registration officially began in October 2017, the Real Life Options Group has also launched a rolling programme for every service. Our aim is to ensure we support all staff to register, ensure every service is fully compliant on a planned basis and that no one gets left behind.



Local managers will notify staff when to apply and they are responsible for completing all of the relevant documentation.

Registration means all staff are required to adhere to the SSSC codes of conduct and means the people of Scotland can count on social services being provided by a trusted, skilled and confident workforce.

We support our members in various ways by linking them up to share ideas, offering training on a range of topics to help upskill their workforce and representing them when talking to the Government about key issues.

What are your hobbies/interests?

Catriona explores her musical skills at Glasgow Science Centre




